Re: Water Quality Certification for EPA NPDES Vessel General Permit for Discharges Incidental to the Normal Operation of Commercial Vessels and Large Recreational Vessels (VGP)

Dear Mr. Flores:

We have received your request for a Water Quality Certification under Section 401 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (Public Law P.L. 92-500), as amended by the Clean Water Act of 1977 (P.L. 95-217), for activities to be permitted under the EPA NPDES Vessel General Permit for Discharges Incidental to the Normal Operation of Commercial Vessels and Large Recreational Vessels (VGP). The Department of Environmental Quality rules governing 401 Water Quality Certification are contained in Oklahoma Administrative Code (OAC) 252:611-3-1 through 252:611-3-6 pursuant to 27A O.S. 2-6-103(C)(2). The Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality waives Clean Water Act 401 Water Quality Certification for the Environmental Protection Agency NPDES Vessel General Permit.

The Oklahoma DEQ has waived certification due to the following:

1. DEQ believes this permit will have limited applicability in the state.
2. DEQ has no reason to believe that the covered discharges will have an appreciable effect on the waters of the state.
3. Access to sufficient data and information are not available for DEQ to certify there will not be an effect on the waters of the state from the specified discharges.




4. Current information does not provide a basis to deny certification of this permit for vessels operating in the state.

To comply with Oklahoma's Water Quality Standards, conditions in the draft permit must remain as stringent as they exist in the draft submitted to the DEQ on July 14, 2008.
