Dear Mr. Flores:

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) is requesting an extension of time to complete the 401 certification of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) draft Vessel General Permit and draft Recreational Vessel General Permit in order to complete TCEQ's notice requirements. I am pleased that our agencies have worked together to initiate the joint public notice process.

Recognizing the importance of having a mutually agreed upon deadline for a certification decision, the TCEQ requests your approval of the following process to define the due date. After the publication of the last public notice EPA will provide TCEQ with copies of all four notices. TCEQ will confirm through email that they have received the notices with a statement of the due date for a certification decision a minimum of 10 working days after the close of the all comment periods. Due to additional TCEQ requirements to notice other state agencies, this date will be no sooner than September 7, 2008.

Re: Vessel General Permit 401 Certification Decision

Dear Mr. Flores:

This letter is in response to the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) July 7, 2008 request for the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to make a written determination regarding the certification under the Section 401 of the Clean Water Act for EPA's Vessel General Permit. This general permit authorizes discharges incidental to the normal operation of commercial vessels and large recreational vessels (greater than 79 feet) while operating in a capacity of transportation.

Authorization is for discharges that occur within inland waters and 3 nautical miles from shore. The EPA estimates that over 91,000 commercial vessels will require coverage under this general permit, with over 41,000 being U.S. flagged cargo and passenger vessels. Examples of the types of vessels that will be authorized by this general permit include barges, tankers, cruise ships, and mobile offshore drilling units. The permit authorizes 28 discharge types, including but not limited to graywater, refrigeration and air condensate, bilgewater, and deck washdown.

All technology-based limits are based on best professional judgment (BPJ). The technology-based limits are represented as best management practices (BMPs) including pollution prevention approaches and structural management practices. Each of the 28 discharge types has at least one BMP.

There are no numeric water quality-based effluent limits (WQBEL). The EPA expects that compliance with the technology-based limits and other permit requirements in the draft general permit will result in discharges that are controlled as necessary to meet applicable WQBELs.
