REPRESENTATIVE EXPERIENCE

- Succesfully resolved an offshore wind ICC dispute for a developer involving construction defect and delay claims.
- Contractually navigated the termination of an interconnection agreement for a solar developer due to the failure of other parties to meet certain condition precedents.
